

150 Years ago during the Civil War, November 1864

- Nov 2 Affair at Hazen's Farm near Devalls Bluff, Arkansas
- Nov 4 Engagement at Johnsonville, Tennessee
- Nov 8 Abraham Lincoln is re-elected President of the United States
- Nov 11 Battle of Bull's Gap, Tennessee
- Nov 15 William T. Sherman departs Atlanta on the March to the Sea, leaving Atlanta in ruins
- Nov 24 Skirmish at Columbia, Tennessee
- Nov 25 Confederates fail at attempt to set fire to New York City hotels and Barnum's Museum
- Nov 28 Rosser's Raid on New Creek near Keyser, West Virginia
- Nov 29 Col. J.M. Chivington leads Sand Creek Massacre in the Colorado Territory
 Battle of Spring Hill, Tennessee

- Nov 30 Battle of Franklin, Tennessee. After failing to destroy John Schofield's Federal army near Spring Hill the previous morning, Gen. John Bell Hood led his 30,000 Confederates to the outskirts of Franklin, Tennessee on November 30, 1864. Determined not to let Schofield reach the safety of Nashville, Hood unleashed a precipitous frontal assault against the entrenched Federal defenders. Despite nearly breaking through the center of the Union line, Hood's forces were driven back with heavy losses. The bloody assault cost Hood more than 6,000 casualties, including six dead Confederate generals.
