### **Current Status Of Park**

All NPS outdoor events at Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park are being conducted.

All trails are open, except as noted, below. All parking lots are open. The Mountain Road parking lot is open when the Mountain Road is open.

Visitor Center is now open; masks are **optional**.

The Visitor Center theater is open - the movie is being shown.

The Mountain Rd.. is open to motorized vehicles on weekdays only (excluding major holidays), however the Park bus is not making trips on the weekend to the Mountain Top until further notice."

### **Trail closures**

The horse trail crossing on John Ward Creek on the Kolb Farm East Trail is closed until further notice because of the treacherous creek crossing there.

The New Salem Church Trail Reroute is now unofficially open! There is still some detail work that needs to be done, which will be done in the upcoming months, one of the items being new signage.

### John Ward Creek Crossing Closed to Horseback Riders

Kennesaw, GA – Effective immediately, the John Ward Creek crossing just south of the Illinois Monument is closed to horseback riders until further notice. This closure stems from a safety concern due to hazardous conditions relating to an unstable streambed. The closure affects the creek crossing between Milepost 3.5 and Milepost 4 of the Kolb's Farm East Trail.

Superintendent Patrick Gamman states, "We are concerned for the safety of all park users. Crossing John Ward Creek at this section of the trail poses a risk that we want to alert our horse community to, as it could potentially cause harm to both horse and rider. We will be working as quickly as possible to mitigate this problem."



### When a Memory Returns

This year's Fourth of July was special; I got to visit with friends at the Marietta parade staging area. Mainly I was happy to see that volunteers and staff from Kennesaw Mountain NBP were participating. It had been years since they were in the parade. It sure was good to see some of the staff and the ones who've been doing Living History, Ambassador and Trail Club work for a long time and great to see that new folks have come aboard. I'm not too good at recalling dates, but it was at least six or seven years ago since the "Mtn" had parade participation. I can't recall how many times I'd marched up Roswell Street to the Square. Before being with the Trail Club, I volunteered working the parade, even being the pace setter for more than several years.

From the 8th grade through 12th I was a drummer in the high school band. Of course that was too many years ago to think of but Atlanta used to have a lot of parades and I marched in them all; and it really was rain or shine; and believe me, no one beats a bass drum louder than me!

I guess that it was the rain this year that brought back some memories. As I mentioned, I met up with people at the staging area, it wasn't too hard to find folks because an earlier rain shower thinned out the crowd. Not the folks from the Mtn; they were grouped around their cannon on a trailer. It was a good visit, and my group was ready to parade - it's good to let the community see the organizations.

But it was eight years ago that some of the same people were around the cannon trailer back at the Park Maintenance area, getting ready to go to the parade and it was raining. In fact "we" were all waiting there to see if the parade would be held. I already had the park's new four seat Gator decorated and parked at my house...I was at the park picking up tools for our group of volunteers and the Teens (from SCA (Student Conservative Association)) who were camping and working with us at the time. Well, it turns out that the parade was canceled that year. The Trail Club did the parade the following 2 years and then no more until this year. And that was also the time that I had to leave volunteering at the park.

While waiting in the rain when the parade was called, I had a good time talking with a fellow Marine, Lance Corporal Squire "Skip" Wells, he was in active reserves and home for the holiday. Skip was a member of the Cannon Crew, a prestigious post. We were both soaking wet, but he was so proud to be there dressed in his very own Living History "Blues," dashing doesn't even come close to how he looked. We talked some about the Corps but also about how much he enjoyed bringing others to run and hike the trails and being a member of the Team. That was the last time that I saw Skip, and I used to rail him about "Whose Truck is That with all USMC stickers!" On July 16,2015 a terrorist shot and killed LCpl Wells along with four other service members at his duty station in Chattanooga, Tennessee.

That year, 2015, I cried when I was awarded Volunteer of

the year at the Park. Yes I'd worked for many years on the trail and with all the people, but Skip had given his life to warn others. Tough doesn't come close to describing that.

Health concerns cut out the work at the Mtn. But like many at an older age, they return to a good memory. I joined the Marine Corps League and have now served as an officer for several years. Of course one of the first things that I did was get our unit in the parade, now our third time in it. And I'm proud to say that "Skip" is right there with us!

### FY 2023 Fundraising Goals

Following is a list of the fundraising goals for this year:

- \$2,000 FY 2023 Friends administrative budget.
- \$3,000 159th Battle Anniversary meals, incidentals
- \$10,000 Funds to be used in conjunction with the Park to acquire an additional cannon and trailer (total cost estimated to be \$82,000) for the Living History program.
- \$3600 to provide for the purchase of 5 bicycle racks and signage for them.
- \$50,000 seed money for the 160th Anniversary of the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain (June, 2024) total estimate for event is expected to be approximately \$150,000.

### Workday 07-08-23

On Friday, July 7, Aron, Bill, Eric, Rich R, Tom, and Mike reviewed the work plans.

We had 14 crew leaders for the workday. They were Aron, Bill, Curt, Eric, Fred, Geoff, Rich B, Rich R, Robert, Scott, Stewart, Todd, Tom, and myself. We had 7 volunteers and 3 Trail Ambassadors. They were Kathy, Rena, and Wendy. They directed traffic and conducted registration. Fred took pictures and Geoff monitored the parking lot. We had volunteers from Boy Scout Troop 1916, the Atlanta Outdoor Club, The Light of the World, and individuals.

On Saturday, I conducted a safety talk to the volunteers at the entrance to Hardage Field, then lead them to the worksite using the new Multi Use Sidewalk along Burnt Hickory. We turned right going south where the sidewalk met reroute and proceeded to where the new part of the trail met the current trail. We formed two groups. The first group using the timber carriers naturalized and eliminated both social trails coming from Burnt Hickory Road. The second group proceeded to deberm the edges of the Crush & Run Trail, taper the trail removing the high spots caused by the Bobcats, move the logs back to the edge of the trail that had been bumped by the Bobcats, and add stones on both sides of the conduits. We stopped when we approached the parked Bobcats. We crossed Burnt Hickory Road, went to the conduit on the north side. We took the stones we had piled to the side on the reroute in January and placed them on both sides of the conduit further up the trail.

Our next workday is Saturday, August 12, 2023. I have before and after pictures.



As you approach the end/beginning of the New Salem Church Reroute, it apparently looks like the trail that connects the Brumby trail to the Pigeon Hill/Kennesaw Mountain Trail is now closed (left photo). But fear not, The trail is still open, as you can see when you get closer (right photo). The redesigned "gate" is to preclude horseback riders from continuing on this trail toward Pigeon Hill and thence onto the Little Kennesaw/Kennesaw Mountain trail. But hikers/walkers are free to continue on. If you are to take trails along the Blue Ridge Parkway, you will encounter similar barriers to preclude horseback riders and cattle from going the wrong way on trails.


