# **Expect Delays at Dallas Hwy and**

Crews will start clearing work for the Whitlock Avenue trail segment of the Kennesaw Mountain Pedestrian Improvements on Monday, Oct. 25. Significant delays are expected along Dallas Highway/Whitlock Avenue between John Ward Road and Cheatham Hill Drive. Crews will be working in the area from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on weekdays, and road capacity will be reduced to one lane.

Traffic delays are expected to be worse in the afternoon in the westbound direction. Alternate routes are recommended.

### New Work Day Registration Procedure - Visitor Center

For several years the Trail Club has been running registration at Old 41 and at the Picnic Area when we were working near the Visitor's Center. We did it that way because we were having 150 to 200 people and had to provide parking for a large number of cars. With the events of the past 2 years, our workdays are now down to about 50 people.

The smaller number created some surprising unforeseen problems that had nothing to do with parking. First, groups were being split up. The part of the group that was dropped off, found themselves standing around wondering where the rest of their group was. Second, the remainder of the group would be at Old 41 waiting for the last person to show up. Then the entire group would walk over to the picnic area together which precipitated forming crews 20 and 30 minutes after the last person arrived.

So, when we will be working in the area of the Visitor's Center, registration and parking will be near the Picnic Area. First, drop off's may be dropped at the 'bus parking spaces' near the entrance to the picnic area. Regular vehicles will go past the "Volunteer" sign, at the end of the loop, and receive a paper 'Temporary Vehicle Permit'. Vehicles will be parked on the administrative road or in the field adjacent to it. Please note that KEMO and NPS parking permits will NOT be accepted, as the cars will be parking in an 'Unauthorized Area'. Paper permits will be provided at the time of entry into this parking area and are good until 12 Noon for that workday only and cannot be reused.

Workday volunteers who wish to park in the regular lots are welcome to do so by using either their own regular vehicle pass or the 'Temporary Vehicle Permit'. Please remember that registration is at 8:00 am and that crews are in the field by 8:15 am.

As always, we, and our patrons, thank all of our Community Volunteers for your assistance in maintaining the trails at Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park. We look forward to seeing you at one of our workdays in the coming months.

## 2021/2022 Fund Raising

Your volunteer hours help greatly for the many projects we do in the park and we greatly appreciate you contributing your "sweat equity" alongside our 80+ staff volunteers who routinely support each event. We are a non-profit all volunteer organization. However, like any business, we do have bills to pay.

Many of our projects are funded by the park or through grants we apply for. These funds are typically targeted for specific projects and do cover the big expenses such as rocks, stone dust, dirt, wood beams, bridges, fences, and such. But, after all the big stuff is paid for, we still have need to cover our day-to-day operating expenses for things like saw blade sharpening, fuel, tool repairs, equipment maintenance, work gloves, bug spray, drinking water, snacks, and porta-potties, along with basic business expenses - e.g. insurance. For these expenses, we rely on your donations.

Each year we kick off a new round of fund raising and this is the 2021/2022 big "ask." We need your help with this, even small donations help. We will conclude this drive at the end of FY 2022 (September, 2022).


We are a nationally recognized club - having been presented the highest award in the National Park Service in 2014, "The Hartzog Award for Volunteer Group." There are several ways to donate:

Upcoming Work Day Schedule:

We are back in the business of trail maintenance! See the sign-up links, above. We are still limiting our numbers, but anyone one is now welcome to sign-up.

Parking and registration will be in the field near the Visitor's Center. Vehicle Entrance Passes will issued at registration.

We monitor weather conditions, especially during the winter. If temperatures will remain below 40 degrees during the work day or precipitation is forecast, we will cancel the workday. Please visit our website to determine the status of the work day - <u>www.kennesawmountaintrailclub.org</u>. We will post a cancellation on the Friday prior to the work day.

The Trail Club will provide supervision and tools. Volunteers should wear work clothes and closed toed shoes. Participants are encouraged to bring their own water, work gloves and masks. The NPS Volunteer Service Agreement and COVID forms are required, signed by a parent or guardian, if the student is under 18 years old. ## Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park Interpretive Programs for February

\*All park programming is free and open to the public. \*\*All programs are outdoors and will be weather dependent

### February 6th @ 11:00 am - 11:30 am Artillery on the Mountain

In the summer of 1864, the peak of Kennesaw Mountain was more than just a scenic location. Confederate soldiers utilized the 1,800 ft. vantage point for a light artillery position just before the battle of Kennesaw Mountain. Learn about the men and tactics used at this position and more. This program will be held just below the peak of Kennesaw Mountain, just past stone viewing station.

### February 12<sup>th</sup> @ 11:00 am – 11:30 am 'Shaping Lincoln: Abraham Lincoln Before his Presidency'

In recognition of Abraham Lincoln's 213<sup>th</sup> Birthday, this program discusses Abraham Lincoln prior to his presidency and what shaped the 16<sup>th</sup> President of the United States of America. This program will be held at the Visitor Center patio.

### **February 13<sup>th</sup> @ 11:00 am – 12:30 pm Guided Mountain Top Hike** This hike will begin at the Visitor Center. The Ranger will take you up the 1.1-mile trail to the

This hike will begin at the Visitor Center. The Ranger will take you up the 1.1-mile trail to the summit of Big Kennesaw. You will be learn about the history of the mountain from before it got its roots to the present. The climb can be challenging for some so please make sure to bring water and proper footwear.

### February 26<sup>th</sup> @ 11:00 am – 11:30 am 13<sup>th</sup> Amendment Program

As the first amendment to the U.S. Constitution to be passed during the Reconstruction area, the 13<sup>th</sup> Amendment abolished slavery in the United States. In recognition of African American history month, the Ranger will discuss the history behind, the debate for, and ultimately the ratification of the amendment. This program will be held at the Visitor Center patio.

### February 27<sup>th</sup> @ 11:00 am – 12:30 pm Guided Assault Trail Hike

Re-trace the footsteps of the Union soldiers who faced fearful odds during the action at Cheatham Hill during the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. The Ranger will use primary accounts of the battle to get you as close to the attack as possible. This hike will begin at the Activity Area 3 parking lot on Cheatham Hill Rd and end at the Illinois Monument.
