


## Skip Wells Tribute from the Atlanta Falcons

The film was shown in the new Mercedes Benz Atlanta Falcons Stadium "in the round" November 12<sup>th</sup> before the Atlanta Falcons/Dallas Cowboys game "Salute to Service" presentation. Ten military service members rappelled from the top of the stadium carrying the game ball which was then given to the Well's family.

For those of you that don't know the story, Skip was a dedicated park volunteer who spent a lot of time here, doing living history and staying in shape for his Marine service. Skip was murdered during a terrorist attack in Chattanooga, TN on July 16, 2015. He died helping other Marines over the motor pool fence to try and escape the gunman. Skip's mother, Cathy, can often be seen at our cannon demonstrations and other associated events as she carries on the spirit of what Skip loved so much. ### Mark Your Calendars!

#### Upcoming Work Day Schedule:

Our trail work days are open to the public on the 2nd Saturday of each month and are a wonderful way to get outside & enjoy nature while helping preserve the national park for future visitors. Registration will open at 8:00 am at the new parking lot, .2 miles north of the Visitor Center on Old 41 and usually are finished by 12:00 p.m. It takes approximately 5 minutes to walk to the picnic area near the Visitor Center - please arrive there by 8:30 am. Activities usually include the use of shovels, rakes, picks, and other tools to fix erosion problems on the 20+ mile trail system. Please do not wear open-toed shoes. Long pants are recommended.

As winter months approach, weather conditions can change quickly. We value our volunteers' health, comfort and safety so to promote safer work conditions, we'll cancel work days if the temperature is below 40 degrees and/or there's a high probability of precipitation. If we must cancel a workday,

we'll post an announcement on the front page of the KMTC website at: [www.kennesawmountaintrailclub.org](http://www.kennesawmountaintrailclub.org)

If your school, church, business, or community organization would like to schedule a special work day as a team building or public service activity, e-mail us at [kmtctrails@kennesawmountaintrailclub.org](mailto:kmtctrails@kennesawmountaintrailclub.org) at least 4 weeks in advance. Trail work can be performed any day of the week.

We work closely with the Park Service and assist the park staff by providing critically needed volunteer effort to install signs, build bridges, and maintain the 20+ miles of trails. Since our beginning in 2002, the Trail Club has donated over 45,000 volunteer hours to Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park.





The hiking component of this event continues the winter hiking tradition popularized for 25 years by Wilderness Wildlife Week. The appeal of winter hiking in the Smokies has a sizeable following and SEFTC is glad to resurrect this winter hiking opportunity.

The evenings will include a Friday Leadership Conference gathering at 4:30 - 7:00 which everyone is welcome to attend; election of officers will be held. Saturday evening between 7 and 9 will be a presentation by a special speaker. Both meetings will be held in the conference center that is part of the Music Road Resort.

SEFTC will be offering multiple daily hikes in the Smoky Mountains on Thursday through Sunday. The narrow bridge over John Ward Creek on the west side of the Park was a safety hazard. Horses waded through the water to the right of the picture but not at high water when the creek rose up to the level of the bridge. This photo was taken after the concrete abutments for the new bridge were poured and after Ray Scott built the cambered falsework to hold up the bridge during construction.



The Club received a NPS Challenge Grant to procure and erect a new bridge. The effort was led by Randall Bailey, PE. The bridge was delivered in many, many pieces shown here.

### **Ranger Led Museum Tour**

Join a Kennesaw Mountain Park Ranger for an in-depth exploration of our museum chronicling the events surrounding the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain.

## **January**

### **January 6 @ 11:00 – 12:30 ‘Guided Mountaintop Hike’**

Join us for a guided hike to the top of Big Kennesaw Mountain. The hike will focus on local and Civil War history, as well some of the ecology of the area. This is an outdoor program, so please prepare accordingly. Length of the hike will be approximately 2 miles, strenuous, and will be weather dependent.

### **January 7 @ 11:00 – 11:30 am ‘Atlanta Campaign’**

This 30 minute ranger-led program focuses on the 1864 Atlanta Campaign and how the Union and Confederate forces moved through the north Georgia countryside to the city of Atlanta. This program will also utilize the various interpretive maps and signs within the Visitor Center.

### **January 13 @ 11:00 – 11:30 am ‘The Importance of NPS Battlefields’**

This 30 minute ranger-led program discusses the importance of preserving historic battlefields and the preservation efforts taken by the National Park Service.

### **January 13 @ 8:30 am – 12:30 pm ‘Kennesaw Mountain Trail Club Work Day’**

Volunteers are needed for each work day to help park staff maintain the 20-plus trails of Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park. Parking and registration is at the overflow parking lot on Old Highway 41. The NPS Volunteer Services Agreement is required. A parent must sign the form if the student is under 18 years old. The form and directions to the registration site are available on the club’s website.

### **January 14 @ 11:00 am – 12:30 pm ‘Guided 24-Gun Battery Hike’**

This program will consist of a ranger guided hike 3 mile hike along the 24 – Gun Battery Trail. It will focus on the importance of preservation, protection, and history within the national parks. This is an outdoor activity, so please dress and plan accordingly. The event will also be cancelled due to inclement weather.

### **January 20 @ 11:00 – 11:30 am ‘Civil War Hygiene...Silent but Deadly’**

Times were tough for the campaigning soldier in the 1860’s. This 30 minute program focuses on the poor hygiene of the average soldier during the American Civil War and explores how this led to large casualty rates and widespread diseases.

## January 27 @ 11:00 – 11:30 ‘Civil War Sharpshooters’

With heritage dating back to Europe, the American sharpshooter has been a vital component of every American conflict. This program will discuss the history of the sharpshooter and the role these men played during the Civil War and in the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain.

## January 28 @ 11:00 am – 12:30 ‘Guided Assault Trail Hike’

Learn more about the fateful Union assault on Cheatham Hill during this ranger-led hike. This trail is one mile, round trip and is classified as moderate to easy. Hike will begin from the Illinois Monument (at Cheatham Hill). This is an outdoor activity, so please dress and plan accordingly. The event will also be cancelled due to inclement weather.


