January 12 Work Day Plans

On January 12 we will be working on the Camp Brumby Trail from just north of Milepost 4.5 (about 3/8 of a mile past Camp Brumby) to the uphill section just past the little creek at about mile 3.7 or so. We will meet at the amphitheater at 8:30 am. Registration opens at 8 am in the Highway 41 parking lot. Please register online prior to January 8th, so that we know how many to expect.

Projects include:

- Deberming the trail to allow water to flow off of the trail
- Clear building sites at Camp Brumby
- Rebuild some fence sections
- •Clear parts of the forest service road of obstructions.

Trail Skills Workshop

The Kennesaw Mountain Trail Club will begin 2019 with two class offerings to enhance the knowledge and leadership skills of our volunteers on the trails.

On Saturday, January 5th, from 9 am - 4 pm, the trail club will hold a Trails Skills Workshop in the education room of the KEMO Visitor Center. All crew leaders, prospective crew leaders, Trail Ambassadors, staff and any KMTC volunteer who would like to learn more about sustainable trail maintenance are invited to attend. The workshop will be led by Jay Dement. Jay has years of trail maintenance experience, is a long-time KMTC volunteer and is currently the President of the Georgia Appalachian Trail Club. Some of the workshop topics will include safety on the trails, water diversion techniques, and sustainable trail maintenance. The class will spend a few hours inside looking at examples of good trail work, then get out in the woods for a short project. Upcoming Work Day Schedule:

Our trail work days are open to the public on the 2nd Saturday of each month and are a wonderful way to get outside & enjoy nature while helping preserve the national park for future visitors. Registration will open at 8:00 am at the new parking lot, .2 miles north of the Visitor Center on Old 41 and usually are finished by 12:00 p.m. It takes approximately 5 minutes to walk to the picnic area near the Visitor Center - please arrive there by 8:30 am. Activities usually include the use of shovels, rakes, picks, and other tools to fix erosion problems on the 20+ mile trail system. Please do not wear open-toed shoes. Long pants are recommended.

As winter months approach, weather conditions can change quickly. We value our volunteers' health, comfort and safety so to promote safer work conditions, we'll cancel work days if the temperature is below 40 degrees and/or there's a high probability of precipitation. If we must cancel a workday,

we'll post an announcement on the front page of the KMTC website at: www.kennesawmountaintrailclub.org

If your school, church, business, or community organization would like to schedule a special work day as a team building or public service activity, e-mail us at kmtctrails@kennesawmountaintrailclub.org at least 4 weeks in advance. Trail work can be performed any day of the week.

We work closely with the Park Service and assist the park staff by providing critically needed volunteer effort to install signs, build bridges, and maintain the 20+ miles of trails. Since our beginning in 2002, the Trail Club has donated over 45,000 volunteer hours to Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park.

Before And After Work On The Lower Mountain Trail

As of last fall the Lower Mountain Trail was both the busiest and most eroded trail in the Park. Below are a few sample before and after pictures of our hard work to put the trail back where it belongs.

BEFORE (October 2017)

AFTER (12/10/18 a day after a 2"rain event)

Mud from the old dirt water bars washed down onto the pavement at the trail head. Chip and Bruce are standing on several inches of mud that ran about 4 feet onto the road. To fix, two water diversion structures were added, one reinforced with one of Bruce's old barn timbers. Water now runs off into two new ditches

to the left in the "after" picture. Rena did the final cleanup.





Along this section, the trail had crept down-hill to the left and erosion from the trail was heading towards the rifle pits of the 1st Alabama near the Picket Line Trail and rutting the trail (here filled with leaves). The original tread was smoothed and the creep section was trashed and closed. Several short crib walls and berms were used to protect the rifle pits until the water could be moved downhill off the trail away from the rifle pits.





We've (Jerry and Richard Angeli and friends) moved this Big Rock a few times. The last time we moved it to this spot to block the social trail so that no one could ever possibly walk to the left of the tree but would have to stay on the trail on the right. We underestimated hikers who moved even farther downhill to the left. Note in the before photo that the trail up the mountain had crept down off the real trail for hundreds of yards. This time we dug up and trashed the creep trail and moved Jerry's Big Rock to form the trail edge, and hikers

now walk on the old trail tread (we hope).





The trail used to be right of the tree. Hikers walked way off the trail (trail creep erosion) to make a new trail. We put the trail back where it belonged and trashed the old creep area. The actual trail was then smoothed over the roots and the steps rebuilt, and, to widen the trail width a bit, an attractive small hiking path was constructed between the trees. Slough was side-hilled on the right to widen the tread.





Note that before, this anonymous hiker's feet were a good 8" off the ground due to erosion. Trip roots and rocks were covered up and used to hold new fill.

The trail here had eroded to 26 feet wide; most hikers walked to a cutoff to the right of the little tree and started to erode. The cutoff was well trashed and the steps were rebuilt by Geoff the rock man and friends to make them more friendly. Just uphill, two more of Bruce's old barn timbers were set to slow the water flow and stop the erosion there.

Eagle Scout Projects - 1st Quarter, Fiscal 2019

We had 10 projects, which is unprecedented, utilizing 179 volunteers for 1429 hours.

We won't keep up this pace for the year, but we did have four Scouts work on the front lawn fencing, and other Scouts who did the new split rail at the Burnt Hickory parking lot, the 24 gun earthworks, a turnpike on the Brumby, five battlefield signs, and fencing at the Whitlock pedestrian crossing, as well as the Illinois Monument, to protect the Union earthworks.
