been built and for what we - together - have accomplished in support of the park. We now have a local, regional, and nationally-recognized Interpretation program, have routine programs offered for the public and for school groups, participate more fully in community outreach, and have done "ground-breaking" work utilizing technology, for interacting with the public and educating them about our park and its resources. This park has outstanding staff who work hard to help people make positive connections with Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park.

On the horizon (for which I've started) for the Interpretive Division are two big projects: a research-based Visitor Use Study (to help the park learn more about our visitors) for FY22, and an updated Long Range Interpretive Plan for FY23. These two documents will help drive future decisions for interpretive programs, exhibits, etc.

The interim plan for succession is to have a person serve in a detail position as Chief of Interpretation for 120 days, during which time a new permanent Chief of Interpretation will be selected.

Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park will always hold a special place in my heart. I give you my sincere thanks for being part of that! The work you do is so important and really does make a difference – to park staff and to our visitors. Wishing you a happy and healthy new year!

Expect delays at Dallas Hwy and Whitlock Ave

Crews will start clearing work for the Whitlock Avenue trail segment of the Kennesaw Mountain Pedestrian Improvements on Monday, Oct. 25. Significant delays are expected along Dallas Highway/Whitlock Avenue between John Ward Road and Cheatham Hill Drive. Crews will be working in the area from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on weekdays, and road capacity will be reduced to one lane.

Traffic delays are expected to be worse in the afternoon in the westbound direction. Alternate routes are recommended.

Your volunteer hours help greatly for the many projects we do in the park and we greatly appreciate you contributing your "sweat equity" alongside our 80+ staff volunteers who routinely support each event. We are a non-profit all volunteer organization. However, like any business, we do have bills to pay.

Many of our projects are funded by the park or through grants we apply for. These funds are typically targeted for specific projects and do cover the big expenses such as rocks, stone dust, dirt, wood beams, bridges, fences, and such. But, after all the big stuff is paid for, we still have need to cover our day-to-day operating expenses for things like saw blade sharpening, fuel, tool repairs, equipment maintenance, work gloves, bug spray, drinking water, snacks, and porta-potties, along with basic business expenses - e.g. insurance. For these expenses, we rely on your donations.

Each year we kick off a new round of fund raising and this is the 2021/2022 big "ask." We need your help with this, even small donations help. We will conclude this drive at the end of FY 2022 (September, 2022).

Like my "Now" drawing - it reminds me of "Larry's big red truck" or one of the park's trucks on a hill. Or it could be a horse kicking up. And "Larry" saying "what what what". Anyway if you don't know Larry, visualize

someone or look back through past newsletters and see him. Think about a volunteer, equipment, what was done and eventually how things worked out.

Unprocessed Therapy- no doubt we've been and are going through a lot of it this past year. Let's all hope that the New Year brings us good memories.

*All programs are outdoors and weather dependent.

January 2nd, 11 am – 12:30 pm - Kennesaw Mountain Rove

A Ranger will be roving in the saddle between Big Kennesaw and Little Kennesaw. If you see them, say hi and strike a conversation about the battlefield!

January 8th, 11 am – Atlanta Campaign Talk

Join one of our park rangers as they give a general overview on the Atlanta Campaign as a whole. We will discuss tactics, battles, and the lasting legacy. Program will be held on the Visitor Center Patio.

January 15th, 2:30 pm – 4:00 pm - Kolb's Farm RoveA Ranger will be stationed at the Kolb Farmhouse. Come on out and ask about the battlefield!

January 16th, 11 am-Reconstruction and Special Orders #15

Special Orders #15 would be one of William T. Sherman's most iconic and discussed military orders during his career. Join us for a virtual program exploring the events surrounding this order and it's legacy. Special guest, Ranger Chris Barr from Reconstruction Era National Historic Park joins us for this program.

This is a virtual program and will debut on the park's Facebook page.

January 22nd, 11 am – 12:30 pm - Illinois Monument Rove

A Ranger will be roving along the Assault Trail to the Illinois Monument at Cheatham Hill. If you see them, say hi and strike a conversation about the battlefield!

January 23rd, 11 am- 24 Gun Battery Hike

The fighting in and around Kennesaw Mountain was known for its brutally- effective artillery action. Experience the Federal cannon positions for yourself with this Ranger led hike. The hike will be roughly 3 miles long and will begin at the Visitor Center. It is weather dependent. Please wear sturdy shoes and bring water.

January 29th, 11 am- The Fighting McCooks

Dan McCook was a notable and well-loved general involved in the Union assault on Cheatham Hill. Col. Dan was also a member of a prominent family with a rich military history known as 'The Fighting McCooks'. Join one of our rangers as we talk about Col. Dan and his family.

This program will be held at the Illinois Monument.

January 30th, 11 am- Assault Trail Guided HikeOn June 27th, 1864, nearly 9,000 Union soldiers made a historic charge into what they believed would be death or capture. Follow in the footsteps of these brave men as this Ranger- guided tour explores the heaviest area of fighting during the battle. The hike will begin at the Activity Area 3 parking lot and end at the Illinois Monument.

Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park Volunteers Help with Historic Landscape Preservation.

Kennesaw, GA: In December 2021, Volunteers Mike Evans and Hewitt Dupont helped Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park with historic landscape preservation. Mr. Evans and Mr. Dupont worked in clearing a section of the historic earthworks along Cheatham Hill Drive, known as the Granbury redoubt. Throughout their two days of work, Evans and Dupont removed pine seedlings and additional brush from in front of the redoubt, enabling park visitors to see the artillery pieces and learn about the military importance of the position.

Mr. Evans and Mr. Dupont spent a week in August clearing a small diamond shaped redoubt, located just north of Dallas Highway along the Hardage Mill Trail. This redoubt was also overgrown with tree saplings, shrubs, and falling tree limbs. Similar to their work in December, the two men completely cleared the position of brush and small trees. Their hard work and dedication helped to restore, retain, and stabilize the integrity of the historic earthwork. In clearing the area, the park can provide additional interpretation of the historical earthworks and cultural landscape in this area of the park.

Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park's Volunteer-In-Parks program plans offer volunteers opportunities in the Spring 2022. These opportunities are based on the work done by Mr. Evans and Mr. Dupont as well as a similar program at Gettysburg National Military Park.
