Current Status Of Park

All NPS outdoor events at Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park are being conducted.

All trails are open, except as noted, below. All parking lots are open. The Mountain Road parking lot is open when the Mountain Road is open.

Visitor Center is open; masks are *optional*. The Visitor Center theater is open - the movie is being shown.

The Mountain Rd. is open to motorized vehicles on weekdays only (excluding major holidays), however the Park bus is not making trips on the weekend to the Mountain Top until further notice."

Trail closures

The horse trail crossing on John Ward Creek on the Kolb Farm East Trail is closed until further notice because of the treacherous creek crossing there.

The New Salem Church trail is currently closed where it crosses Burnt Hickory Rd. while the multiuse trail is being constructed there and New Salem Church Trail reroute is being completed. Current plans are to have the reroute completed by late June, 2023.

Expect delays at Dallas Hwy and Whitlock Ave

Some work continues on the trail segment along Whitlock Ave, and some delays can still be expected. Significant delays are expected along Dallas Highway/Whitlock Avenue between John Ward Road and Cheatham Hill Drive. Crews will be working in the area from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on weekdays, and road capacity will be reduced to one lane.

Traffic delays are expected to be worse in the afternoon in the westbound direction. Alternate routes are recommended.

Museum Tours every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday @ 2:00 pm!

March 4, @ 11 am – 'Kennesaw Mountain's Illinois Monument: Commemorating the Past, Honoring the Present and Inspiring the Future'

The story of Kennesaw Mountain did not end after the battle in 1864 but was continued by the veterans who fought on the battlefield. The ranger will discuss how Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park was established through efforts of Union veterans who fought at Cheatham Hill.

March 5, @ 11 am – Memorial Field Walk

As a diversionary tactic, several companies of men would make a fateful charge against the base of Kennesaw Mountain on June 27th, 1864. In this short, guided walk, one of our rangers will use firsthand accounts and official records to put the action in perspective.

March 11, @ 11 am – Assault Trail History Hike

On June 27th, 1864, nearly 9,000 Union soldiers made a historic charge into what they believed would be death or capture. Follow in the footsteps of these brave men as this ranger - guided tour explores the heaviest area of fighting during the battle.

*This program is not at the Visitor Center; parking is at the Activity Area 3 on Cheatham Hill Rd.

March 12, @ 11 am – Guided Mountain Top Hike

This ranger - led hike will take you roughly 1 mile up to the peak of Big Kennesaw Mountain. Along the way, you'll learn about the flora and fauna of the area and the history that shapes us from pre - history, through Civil War and on to today. The hike is semi - strenuous so bring water and good shoes.

March 18, @ 11 am – The Fighting McCooks

On June 27, 1864, Colonel Daniel McCook, Jr. led the Federal assault up Cheatham Hill, where he was mortally wounded. This brave man was not the only McCook to fight for the Federal army. This 30-minute program will introduce the 'Fighting McCooks', the story of 3 Ohio brothers and their 15 sons who joined the Federal forces and fought throughout the Civil War.

March 19, @ 11 am – Battle of Kolb's Farm Guided Walk

Occurring on June 22, 1864, the Battle of Kolb's Farm would foreshadow the storm to come. In response to the seemingly impregnable 'Kennesaw Line', Sherman sends probing forces down the Powder Springs Rd. to find a way around. Johnston would shift his line to meet the threat, and conflict would erupt in the summer stillness. This short ranger walk and talk will highlight some aspects of this battle.

March 25, @ 11 am – Medal of Honor Day Talk

The Medal of Honor is the highest honor that can be bestowed in the U.S. military. Join volunteer Andrew Bramlett as he presents this program that focuses on Cobb County's connections to the Medal of Honor, from the Great Locomotive Chase to the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain and the recipients buried at the Marietta National Cemetery.

John Ward Creek Crossing Closed to Horseback Riders

Kennesaw, GA – Effective immediately, the John Ward Creek crossing just south of the Illinois Monument is closed to horseback riders until further notice. This closure stems from a safety concern due to hazardous conditions relating to an unstable streambed. The closure affects the creek crossing between Milepost 3.5 and Milepost 4 of the Kolb's Farm East Trail.

Superintendent Patrick Gamman states, "We are concerned for the safety of all park users. Crossing John Ward Creek at this section of the trail poses a risk that we want to alert our horse community to, as it could potentially cause harm to both horse and rider. We will be working as quickly as possible to mitigate this problem."



Service Animals

The idea or concept of Service Animals brings to mind dogs picking up objects, opening doors, etc. It also brings up 'horror stories' of peacocks, cats, snakes, etc. being taken on board airplanes. Then, again, you hear that 'emotional support animals' are allowed within public buildings and that, we, as Trail Ambassadors, Crew Leaders, Educational volunteers, have to just accept whatever comes in the doors, as service animals.

First off, let's define a 'service animal'.

"The ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) defines service animals as dogs that are individually trained to do work or perform tasks for people with disabilities. Examples of such work or tasks include: guiding people who are blind, alerting people who are deaf, pulling a wheelchair, alerting and protecting a person who is having a seizure, reminding a person with mental illness to take prescribed medications, calming a person with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) during an anxiety attack, or performing other duties." (2010 Standards)

The first sentence is the most important, with the key words being: dogs, individually trained, perform tasks. The examples of tasks performed, listed above, are highly specific.

Now, let's dispel some misconceptions. Service animals are NOT pets, they are working dogs. Many service animals know that when their vest goes on, they are immediately at work, however service animals are not required to wear a vest, have any sort of certification, etc. The dog does not have to be a certain size or breed, but common breeds include labs, and german shepherds and frequently mixed breeds.

By definition, cats, snakes, peacocks, etc. are not service animals, regardless of what they do. Also, by ADA definition, 'emotional support animals' are not considered 'service animals'. 'Emotional support animals', may be part of a medical treatment, by helping to dispel loneliness, anxiety and certain phobias. However, these tasks are NOT highly specific in nature and do not require special training.

According to the ADA, the handler is responsible for the care and handling of the dog, at all times. 'Service animals' must be:

- Housebroken
- · Under control by the handler, at all times
- Fully vaccinated in accordance with state and local laws
- The ADA does not require that facilities clean up after the dog.
- Do not require a certification or an identification card or vest.

The ADA, also, requires that the owner be willing to answer

two questions:

- · Is the animal required because of a disability?
- What work or task has the animal been trained to perform?

These questions cannot be asked if the function or disability is obvious. Examples include guiding a person who is blind or has low vision, or opening a door for an individual in a wheel chair, etc.

The facilities are required to admit a service dog into all facilities where people are admitted including restaurants, public buildings, etc. 'No pets policy' and breed restrictions do not apply.

How does all of this pertain to the Visitor's Center? If a dog enters the VC, we, as volunteers, should notify an NPS staff member and allow them to handle the situation. We can answer general questions on the subject, but any specific situations or questions need to be handled by the staff.

There are numerous other requirements of different situations such as employment, hotel accommodations, etc. In general, 'service animals' have become an integral part of our society but the dogs, the handlers and the facilities have certain responsibilities

Scott Mackay is working on the establishment of an endowment fund. Details will follow.



FY 2023 Fundraising Goals
