

All NPS outdoor events at Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park are being conducted.

All trails are open, except as noted, below. All parking lots are open. The Mountain Road parking lot is open when the Mountain Road is open.

Visitor Center is now open; masks are *optional*. The Visitor Center theater is open - the movie is being shown.

The Mountain Rd. is open to motorized vehicles on weekdays only (excluding major holidays)

The shuttle bus is now transporting visitor to/from the Visitor Center/Kennesaw Mountain Top Parking Lot on weekends.

Trail closures

The horse trail crossing on John Ward Creek on the Kolb Farm East Trail is closed until further notice because of the treacherous creek crossing there.

November 4, @11 am– Life of a Soldier

Life for the infantry soldier (Union or Confederate) was anything but easy. Long marches, bad food, and worse living conditions made it tough going for these young men. Join us as we lay out the gear that made such intense campaigning possible. You will see period- correct uniforms, weaponry and even get up close and personal with artifacts from the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain!

November 5, @11 am– Assault Trail Hike On June 27th, 1864, nearly 9,000 Union soldiers made a historic charge into what they believed would be death or capture. Follow in the footsteps of these brave men as this ranger - guided tour explores the heaviest area of fighting during the battle.

*The hike will begin at the Activity Area 3 parking lot and end at the Illinois Monument.

November 11, @11 am, 12 pm, 2 pm and 3 pm– Artillery Demonstrations Artillery was a vital component to the operations of both armies during the Atlanta Campaign and played

a key role in several engagements during the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. For Veterans' Day, our Living Historians will be dressing the part and firing the cannon at the above- mentioned times.

November 12, @11 am, 12 pm, 2 pm and 3 pm– Infantry Demonstrations Life for the infantry soldier (Union or Confederate) was anything but easy. Long marches, bad food, and

worse living conditions made it tough going for these young men. Our living historians will be setting up camp at the Visitor Center with musket- firing demonstrations at the above- mentioned times.

November 18, @11 am – Mountaintop Hike

This ranger - led hike will take you roughly 1 mile up to the peak of Big Kennesaw Mountain. Along the way, you'll learn about the flora and fauna of the area and the history that shapes us from pre - history, through Civil War and on to today. The hike is semi - strenuous so bring water and good shoes!

November 19, @11 am- Sherman's March to the Sea

Following his two-month occupation of Atlanta, Major General William T. Sherman initiated his March to the Sea. In November of 1864, Sherman's 60,000-man army departed Atlanta and began campaigning to "make Georgia howl". Many have called him a war criminal, a dutiful soldier, a madman or a great factician. Discover the history behind the maneuver that sealed the fate of two nations.

November 25, @11 am- Red- Tailed Hawks: Kennesaw Mountain's Bird of Prev

Come out and enjoy a ranger-led program on the beautiful Red-tailed Hawk, one of Kennesaw Mountain's Birds of Prey. During the presentation, the ranger will help visitors become more familiar with this majestic animal by understand their habitat, family dynamics, and how we can help protect them for future generations.

 * This program is not at the Visitor Center; it will be held on the Kennesaw Mountain Overlook - shuttle service is provided.

John Ward Creek Crossing Closed to Horseback Riders


Kennesaw, GA – Effective immediately, the John Ward Creek crossing just south of the Illinois Monument is closed to horseback riders until further notice. This closure stems from a safety concern due to hazardous conditions relating to an unstable streambed. The closure affects the creek crossing between Milepost 3.5 and Milepost 4 of the Kolb's Farm East Trail.

Superintendent Patrick Gamman states, "We are concerned for the safety of all park users. Crossing John Ward Creek at this section of the trail poses a risk that we want to alert our horse community to, as it could potentially cause harm to both horse and rider. We will be working as quickly as possible to mitigate this problem."



FY 2023 Fundraising Goals *(FY 2024 Fundraising Goal has not been Established)* Following is a list of the fundraising goals for this year:

- \$2,000 FY 2023 Friends administrative budget.
- \$3,000 159th Battle Anniversary meals, incidentals
- \$10,000 Funds to be used in conjunction with the Park to acquire an additional cannon and trailer (total cost estimated to be \$82,000) for the Living History program.

October 10-14-23 Work Day

On Friday, October 13, Aron, Bill, Mark, Tom, and I reviewed the work planned and put the flags out.

We had 11 crew leaders for the work day. The Crew Leaders were Aron, Bill, Curt, Donald, Eric, Mark, Rich B, Robert, Scott, Tom, and Mike. We had 4 Trail Ambassadors: they were Catherine, Rena, Yvonne, and Wendy. They did registration and directed the volunteers to the parking area. We had 10 volunteers. The volunteers were from the Hillgrove JROTC, Allatoona JROTC, Kennesaw State University individual, the Atlanta Outdoor Club, and individuals (no more than 3 from any one group). Donald went to assist on the Eagle Scout Project.

On Saturday, I welcomed the volunteers at the picnic area. We then walked to the tool shed where a safety briefing was conducted and split our volunteers into two teams and the crew leaders into three teams. I went between Teams answering questions and ensuring the work plan was being followed. Scott took pictures.

Team 1 was led by Aron with Rich B and Robert assisting and was made up of individuals from KSU, the Atlanta Outdoor Club, and individuals (5). They worked on eliminating the social trail going down the service road until we get the new fence installed next year. Upon finishing that project, they went to on to where they eliminated the trail creep going down the concrete stairs going up to the upper parking lot. With the use of timber carriers several large cut sections of logs were moved in an attempt to stop the trail creep, from there they worked on addressing erosion and trail creep issues.

Team 2 was led by Eric with Mark and Bill assisting and made up of the Hillgrove JROTC and Allatoona JROTC groups (5). They worked on the trail, starting at the bottom of the Grand Staircase going to the top. They repaired and replaced a combination of 5 stone steps. In addition, they worked on the trail creep on both sides and the erosion on the top left side.

Team 3 was Tom and Curt with some help from Scott repairing the fencing issues detailed in the work plan.

The biggest surprise of the day was the heavy fog and mist at the beginning of the work day. This undoubtedly kept some of our volunteers from attending. However, by 11:30 when we started to go back down the mountain to turn in our tools, it was becoming a nice day with the sun shining. The volunteers that attended did not let the weather deter them. They worked hard resulting in us accomplishing a large portion of the scheduled work.

2023/2024 Fund Raising
